Indiana University is a Tier I public research institution of higher education offering a full range of degrees. IU has seven campuses across the state of Indiana. Its flagship campus of 43,000 students is in Bloomington, a town of 80,000 residents, about 50 miles/80 kilometers south of Indianapolis. IU offers a beautiful campus, sports, clubs, music, and theater, in addition to its exceptional academics.

The College of Arts and Sciences is the largest academic unit on the Bloomington, offering over 2,000 courses each semester in the arts and humanities, social sciences, natural sciences, media and journalism, art and design, and international studies.

Credits	Exchange students must register for a minimum of 12 credits to maintain full-time student status. Most students take 15 credits. Since many courses are 3 credits per semester, this is equivalent to five courses.

(See Academic units above) Meet College language requirements: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> TOEFL Total 95; minimum scores of 22 in Speaking and Listening sections IELTS Total 7; minimum scores of 6.5 in Speaking and Listening sections <p>Note: These scores are higher than the minimum required by IU for admission since exchange students have limited time to improve their language skills. Contact the program director if nominating students who have test scores lower than this.</p>

Student Visa information	Once admitted, IU will provide a DS-2019 form for the exchange student to apply for a J-1 visa at the U.S. Embassy. More information can be found here: https://ois.iu.edu/visas/student-visas/j1/index.html
Mandatory Health Insurance and Health Requirements	<p>Students are required to have health insurance for their entire stay in the United States. Details are available here: https://ois.iu.edu/living-in-the-us/health/insurance/index.html. Students who already have qualifying coverage may request an exemption here, after their application to Indiana University is complete.</p> <p>Indiana state law requires proof of vaccination against certain diseases, including COVID-19. IU will provide information on how to provide proof after admission to IU.</p>
