### Language requirements

Minimum recommended level of English proficiency: 'B2' of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR). In order to successfully participate in our courses an advanced level of English is necessary. Students do not need to provide a proof of language proficiency. Instead, we kindly ask students to take responsibility for having a sufficient knowledge of English prior to their studies at FPN.

#### Semester dates

#### Fall semester

Late August - January (Period 1, 2, 3), or Late August- December (Period 1,2)

### Spring semester

Late January - July (Period 4, 5, 6), or Late January - June (Period 4, 5)

### Academic year

Late August - July (Period 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6), or Late August - June (Period 1, 2, 3, 4, 5)

### Nomination deadline (via e-mail)

Fall semester / Full year: 30 April Spring semester: 30 October

### **Application deadline**

Fall semester / Academic year: 15 May Spring semester: 15 November

### Introduction week

Prior to the start of classes, mandatory introduction days take place. FPN's introduction days entail among other things, a Problem Based Learning (PBL) training, a campus tour and a social event.

### **Important note:**

If you want to take a resit (= second chance to pass the exam) you have to be present in Maastricht to take part at the scheduled day/time/location. If you have already returned to your home country the resit will not be faxed, sent or e-mailed to your home university.

On a different note: it is equally important to know that if you still have to take exams of your home university it is not possible to take them here in Maastricht. You either go back and take them at home, or you make arrangements to take the exams in your own country before you come to Maastricht (which is not an excuse to miss the introduction days).

#### **Application procedure**

If your home university has a formal exchange agreement with our faculty, you can apply for an exchange period through the IRO of your own university. All exchange students need to be nominated by their home university. Please contact the International Relations Office of your home university to be nominated for the Maastricht University Faculty of Psychology and Neuroscience exchange programme. Once your nomination is received, you will be provided with the application instructions.

#### Courses

In the course overview on our website (available as of mid-April) you can find all the information you need about FPN bachelor's courses, such as the course coordinator(s), learning outcomes and competences, number of ECTS, literature and prerequisites.

#### **Course selection**

When selecting courses, please note that some courses will assume knowledge of topics covered in previous courses, called prerequisites. If you do not meet these requirements, you are not allowed to select these courses. Students are responsible for making sure that they have the required knowledge to take courses that state certain prerequisites.

### Master's courses (Fall only)

Students who completed their Bachelor's programme (180 ECTS) can submit a request to the Board of Examiners to take up to two Master's courses from the one-year Master's programme in Psychology.

### **Course selection period**

Fall / Full-Year:

Monday 15 April course selection opens Friday 21 June course selection closes (23:59 hrs. CET) Exchange students receive a link (!)

Spring

Monday 4 November course selection opens Friday 22 November course selection closes (23:59 hrs. CET) Exchange students receive a link (!)

### **Course registration**

At Maastricht University students have to register for their courses and exams. This is  $\underline{not}$  applicable to exchange students. The FPN Education Office books the courses and exams for exchange students, based on their course choices during course selection.

### Course schedule / time table

About two weeks before the start of each course period your personal course schedule / time table will be published in the Student Portal.

### **Teaching method**

There are about 10-15 study hours per week. These consist of lectures, tutorial groups and practicals. Classes take place multiple days a week, and vary per week/period. In addition to classes, you should expect about 20 hours of independent learning per week.
