Teresa has previously worked with Cherish and the ISPCC, and has had roles in youth and community work. She was a ministerial appointee to the Advisory Committee on Better Outcomes Brighter Futures and she chairs the LINC Consortium steering group. Teresa holds an MBS, a Degree in Social Science, and a Professional Certificate in Governance.
