Categories

Applications are sought across five award categories:

1. Early-Career Researcher (within 7 years of PhD)

- Recognition of research excellence commensurate with career stage.
- To qualify for this category, nominees must be a member of research or academic staff within 7 years of PhD conferring date.¹

2. Mid-Career Researcher (between 7-15 years of PhD)

- Recognition of research excellence commensurate with career stage.
- To qualify for this category, nominees must be a member of research or academic staff between 7-15 years of PhD conferring date.

3. Established Researcher Award

Recognition of distinguished achievements/outstanding contributions at an established career stage.

• To qualify for this category, nominees must be a member of research or academic staff more than 15 years post-PhD.

4. Research Supervisor Award

• Recognition of excellent research supervision and the early career development of research students.

5. Research Team Award

- Recognition of an outstanding and impactful research initiative or project based on a collaborative team approach, involving two or more members of research and/or academic staff.
- Significant milestones of the research project/initiative should have been completed in the last 3-5 years.

¹ Allowance will be given for documented leave in line with ERC guidelines. For maternity, the effective elapsed time since the start date will be considered reduced by 18 months for each child born before or after the start date. For paternity, the effective elapsed time since the start date will be considered reduced by the documented amount of paternity leave actually taken for each child born before or after the start date. For long-term illness, clinical training or national service the effective elapsed time since the start date will be considered reduced by the documented amount of leave actually taken.

Nomination process

The completed Nomination Form must be completed and submitted by one of the nominators as a single pdf via the Application Submission form on the <u>dedicated section of the Research Community Portal</u> according to timelines set out above. Further details are as follows:

Individual	University of Galway research and academic staff are eligible for nomination.
Researcher	An individual can only win once in a given category within a five-year period.
Awards	 Only one award will be presented to an individual in a given year.

Evaluation panel and criteria

The assessment panels will include representatives of the following: Vice-President for Research and Innovation, Vice-Deans for Research and Innovation, Dean of Graduate Studies, Vice-Deans of Graduate Studies, Directors of Research Institutes, Director of Planning and Institutional Research, and an External Representative.

Individual Researcher Awards (relevant to career stage)

Research Activity	Does the nominee contribute to the body of knowledge in their area? This might include: planning and carrying out high-quality research; attracting research funding; building and/or leading research groups; providing supervision and support for postgraduate students to enable them to produce quality research; networking and collaborating with others, both internally and externally, to optimise the value and relevance of their research; and/or communicating their research activity/outcomes to the public or other stakeholders.
Research Outputs	Does the nominee demonstrate a record of research outputs recognised for originality, significance and rigour? This may include publications in leading international journals and conferences and in peer-reviewed book chapters, authored books and/or monographs, edited volumes, research reports, policy briefs, data sets, invention disclosures, creative disclosures, etc.
Research Impact and Recognition	Impact: Evidence of substantial impact of research (or expected impact), whether academic, cultural, economic, educational, environmental, health, political, social or technological. This may be achieved through research outputs, research-based collaborations, engagement with government, the public sector, society, cultural bodies, industry, commercialisation of research, patents, etc., as appropriate to the discipline. · ·	Does the nominee have significant experience of supervising research students to successful timely completion?
	Does the nominee provide effective research training aligned with the principles of the National Framework for Doctoral Education? ²
student career	Does the nominee provide effective mentorship to research students, by providing opportunities for tailored training relevant to students' career aspirations, aligned to the IUA PhD Graduate Skills statement? ³

Team Award

	Is the team's research initiative/project addressing a pressing/significant/challenging research question/problem?
	Does the application demonstrate a team approach? Is there collaboration with others, between or across disciplines and/or engagement with stakeholders?
Outputs/Impact	Has the team delivered excellent outputs and impact?*

^{*}Significant milestones of the research project/initiative should have been completed in the last 3-5 years.

Award allocation

Within each individual category $2 \times 1,000$ awards will be made to support the research activity of the recipient or the continued development of excellent research supervision.

Within each category, one award goes to each of the following:

- A researcher from within the Colleges of Arts, Social Sciences, and Celtic Studies or Business, Public Policy and Law
- A researcher from within the Colleges of Medicine, Nursing, and Health Sciences, or Science and Engineering

There will be one Research Team Award with a number shortlisted in advance of the announcement of the overall awardee.
