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RESPONDING TO THE NEEDS OF HEALTH SERVICE PROVIDERS

It is estimated that there are more than 4.000 children in Ireland living with complex life-limiting conditions (Ling et al., 2015; Fraser et al., 2021). Children who have complex care requirements or reach the end of life deserve the highest standard of care provided by specialised paediatric palliative or complex care nurses. Unfortunately, it is acknowledged internationally that there is an absence of HCPs who demonstrate the very specific and special skills to work in this demanding specialty.

JOIN A COLLABORATIVE PROGRAMME

This curriculum has been developed in conjunction with the School of Nursing and Midwifery, University of Galway, and the School of Nursing, Midwifery and Health Systems, University College Dublin (UCD). You will develop your clinical skills and build relationships with mentors / experts within the specialty by completing clinical placement in a children's palliative care / complex setting.
