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Why study this programme?

The aim of this MSc in Childhood Speech, Language, and Communication Needs is to provide a critical and conceptually sophisticated understanding of children with S.L.C.N. and the contexts of their lives.

This programme has been designed to meet the needs of busy practitioners who wish to keep up to date with the emerging evidence base when working with children with S.L.C.N. in the clinic, classroom, and community.

Our flexible blended learning approach combines weekly classes (in-person and streamed live online) with on-line self-directed learning to support you as a busy practitioner with many competing demands on your time.

Course activities and skills training enable you to apply new knowledge and skills directly in the clinic, classroom, and community. This MSc is not a professional qualification in Speech and Language therapy.

Programme outline

The programme is comprised of 5 core modules (compulsory) plus a Minor Dissertation.

The core modules are:

- Advanced Research Methods
- Narratives in Childhood
- Using Evidence to Inform Practice
- Cultural, Linguistic, & Social Diversity in Health & Education
- Supporting Children with S.L.C.N.
- Minor Dissertation (thesis) (year long)

The interdisciplinary and blended learning environment will provide opportunities for you, the busy professional to reflect on your current practice and embed your new knowledge and skills in the clinic, classroom, and community.
