Application requirements:	Minimum GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale (or equivalent).
	Students applying for Science and Engineering courses will have their applications assessed by the relevant disciplines before being accepted to take relevant modules.

Application timelines:	Full Year/Semester One: 1 February to 30 April
	Semester Two: 1 August to 31 October

Course catalogue:	All courses offered to visiting students are listed in our handbooks located on our website.
How many modules/credits can be taken in each semester?	Each class is weighted at 5 or 10 ECTS credits. You can take up to 30 ECTS credits per semester, which is a normal course load for University of Galway students.
Where can I find timetables?	Timetables are available on discipline websites. These are linked in the relevant discipline area of the student handbook.
When will academic transcripts be sent?	Within weeks of the end of the examination period, transcripts will be sent to the international offices of partner institutions.

Accommodation	
On-campus accommodation:	University of Galway offers some accommodation on-campus in our <u>student residences</u> . We host a lottery for on campus accommodation after our applications deadline. Students will be contacted directly with information on how to apply for the lottery via email.
Off-campus accommodation:	University of Galway's <u>Accommodation Advisory Service</u> offers advice and assistance. University of Galway has a purpose-built portal for off-campus accommodation called <u>Studentpad</u> .
