



"The Arts in Action programme has been an invaluable asset to the cultural life of the University and to its teaching this past academic year. As a member of the University, I attended multiple inspiring events in the series over both semesters and found it a greatly enriching experience. As a lecturer, the programme has served an especially important purpose for one of our 1BA English modules, EN1101 Literature and the Social World, which has 393 students registered.

The assessment for this module includes two Field Work assignments requiring students to attend and critically reflect upon a cultural event in the region. The Arts in Action series was our primary recommendation for this assignment. The impressive range of its events allowed students to write on elements of the module featuring literature, music, dance, film/media, and/or environmental creativity. It also served a crucial equality function: many students struggle with finding time and/or money for attending cultural events, whereas the Arts in Action programme allowed us to direct them towards events that were free and readily accessible to them on campus."
