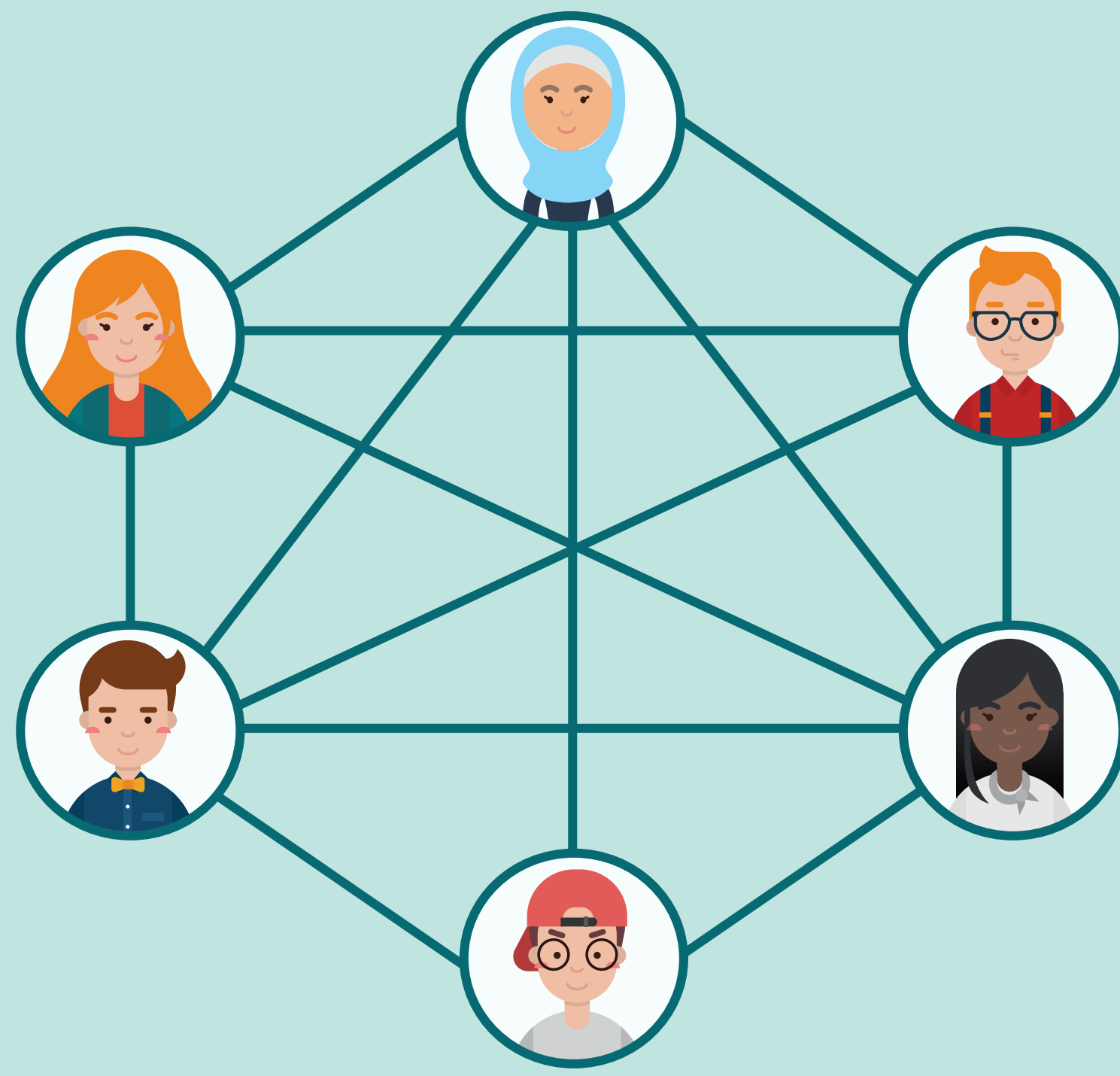
*What is CÉIM?*

## Weekly meet ups with your fellow students

CÉIM\* is a peer learning programme for 1st year students and is run as a partnership between students, the Students' Union and the University of Galway.

You'll meet weekly in small groups with students from your course and trained student leaders from higher years of your course. You'll be able to ask questions, take part in fun mini activities, discuss coursework and learn together.
