Overview of MA Programme and Designated Emphasis

You are coming in as an MA in Drama and Theatre Studies student but can choose a designated emphasis for deeper specialization in the programme.

This designated emphasis will appear on your degree records.

Available designated emphases include:

A designated emphasis means that you take a narrower and curated selection of modules in these areas. For the designated emphasis in Playwriting and Dramaturgy, this also means that you do a playwriting dissertation and work with a playwriting mentor in addition to staff supervisor.

- Theatre Practice and Production
 - Must take as electives: Choose 3 of 4-Ensemble Acting and Devising, Performance Lab, Applied Theatre, Drama and Theatre Studies Work Placement
- Playwriting and Dramaturgy
 - Must take as electives: Playwrights Workshop I, Performance Lab and do playwriting dissertation
- If you do not declare a designated emphasis, you can curate your selection of modules any way that you like over the two terms.

Semester One Modules

- Critical Methods in Drama, Theatre and Performance (CORE FOR ALL)
- Choose from:
 - Ensemble Acting and Devising
 - Playwright's Workshop I
 - Producing I
 - Creative Arts Ideas Lab
- NOTE: Some sessions for second semester core module "Creative Practices in Drama, Theatre and Performance" will take place in semester one.

Semester Two Modules

- Creative Practices in Drama Theatre and Performance (CORE FOR ALL)
 - NOTE: Some sessions for this module begin in semester one.
- Choose from:
 - Performance Lab
 - Applied Theatre
 - Drama and Theatre Studies Work Placement

"DT6100: Dissertation" is core for all MA students and runs through the end of August 2025 with work and supervision happening over the summer months.

Students usually remain resident in Galway during this time.

DRUID THEATRE


Founded in 1975, Druid is a touring theatre company, anchored in the West of Ireland and looking to the world. Druid will be 50 in 2025.

Druid is a writers' theatre, exploring ambitious projects, reimagining classics and premiering new work annually.

The company has toured the length and breadth of Ireland through their 'Unusual Rural Tours' (URTs) as well as touring internationally to the UK, USA, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Japan and Hong Kong.

Highlights include:

- The Beauty Queen of Leenane by Martin McDonagh (1996), in a co-production with the Royal Court Theatre, which went on to win four Tony Awards, including Best Director for Garry Hynes, the first woman to win an award for directing in the history of the Tony Awards
- The Leenane Trilogy by Martin McDonagh, in a co-production with Royal Court Theatre, London (1996-2000)
- DruidSynge (2005); DruidMurphy (2012); DruidShakespeare (2015-18); DruidGregory (2020); Druid O'Casey (2023)
- 'Waiting for Godot (2016-2018); 'Endgame' (2024)

When can students submit work late?

- Students should ONLY seek to submit work late in the event of serious extenuating circumstances which is defined by university policy QA209 as "serious unavoidable, unpredictable and exceptional circumstances outside the control of the student, which may negatively impact the student's performance in assessment."

Students with approved extenuating circumstance can ask for and receive extensions ONLY from Head of Year/Programme (less than seven days, with documentation) OR CASSCS.



If students have met the grounds for extenuating circumstances

- 1. An extension: This is when the College of Arts Office and/or Programme allows you to submit work late without penalty following a process of application with documentation (I.e. medical or other certificates).
- **2. A deferral:** This is when you get College of Arts Office permission to submit outstanding work following the end of a module without penalty in the autumn exam



FYI: Any student who needs to submit work more than seven days late can ONLY have this decision cleared by the College of Arts unless they have an accommodation from Disability Support Services.

Other housekeeping...

- Classes start ON the hour, end TEN TO the hour.
- Your modules will require that you use Canvas to access course content
- For many modules, you will need to come dressed to MOVE.
- ALL communication will be done through your universityofgalway.ie email from next week.



Preparing for classes

- There are lots of readings to prepare in advance of classes and sometimes recordings or videos to view.
- Check Canvas to access readings and viewings
- If you have problem accessing readings, contact your lecturer
- Lecturers will not always engage directly with readings in class but post them so you understand where ideas are coming from and to deepen learning.
- If a reading/viewing is essential for class a lecturer should tell you this in advance or it will be obvious from the content. For example, the class is on Teresa Deevy and so you need to read her play *Katie Roche* in advance.


