








Type 1 Diabetes

- Autoimmune Disease characterised by insulin deficiency
- Requires intensive self-management
- Approx. 14,000-16,000 people in Ireland with T1D
- Males and females aged 15–34 years with T1D have a mortality rate 3.8 and 6.6 times greater than age/sex matched controls
- Young adults with T1D at risk of poor complications

Florence	HCPs interviews (n=6)	Focus Group with patients pre use (n=5) Pilot use of Florence for 4 weeks followed by Focus Group (n=7)	Patient use of Florence for 4 week period followed by a consultation using the T1C tool.


