


















Incomes and Life Expectancy






Figure 2.5. Probability of not being employed over the working life by parent educational background (PEB) and inequality





In countries with higher levels of inequality – intergenerational transmission of disadvantage is greater






Income Inequality (GINI) Eurostat 2022
