Definition:

ADHD Ireland¹ describes ADHD as:

"... a medical/neurobiological condition in which the brain's neurotransmitter chemicals; noradrenalin and dopamine do not work properly. It is a disorder that, without proper identification, treatment and management, can have serious and long-lasting consequences and/or complications for an individual. It is a genetic and long-term condition which affects learning and behaviour right through the school years and in many cases beyond into adulthood.

ADHD is a disorder that can co-exist to a greater or lesser degree, with any or other disorders such as dyslexia, autism, learning disorder, dyspraxia, conduct disorder, oppositional defiance disorder. It is important to note that ADHD is a very treatable condition. If diagnosed and properly treated, people with ADHD can reach their potential and lead happy and successful lives."



If you wish to be assessed for ADHD, we recommend visiting a GP first.

Use others to motivate you,

("Body doubling"),

Use the Pomodoro Technique, having short but frequent breaks can keep your concentration up.



In Lectures, sit at the front to minimise distraction.

Actively take notes even if you don't use them to revise.



Spend a few minutes going over lecture material the day before.

Wear headphones to block out sound. Music with no lyrics can help keep your energy up without distraction.
