

Student Sustainability Leadership Awards Programme 2025



INTRODUCTION

Sustainability is a core value at the University of Galway, enshrined in our Strategic Plan 2020-2025. Sustainability and the SDGs are at the heart of everything we do. We are implementing our second Sustainability Strategy 2021-2025, embedding sustainability in our culture, operational policies, and governance structures, and empowering our communities to be champions of sustainability and the SDGs.

In January 2024, University of Galway established a centralised Sustainability Office, to champion sustainability in all aspects of university learning and research, culture, operations, and governance structures, and to empower its diverse communities of staff, students, and partners to co-create tomorrow's sustainable campus and deliver the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Recognising the leading role that our students play in the transition to a sustainable future on our campus, the Sustainability Office is offering two paid internships for students enthusiastic about promoting and embedding sustainability on campus. The internships are part of the Student Sustainability Leadership Awards Programme that aims to advance the University of Galway Sustainability Strategy objective 'to develop on campus student sustainability leadership opportunities.

STDUENT SUSTAINABILITY INTERNSHIPS 2025

Student Sustainability Leadership Awards are available for up to 2 University of Galway students to support the implementation of our sustainability strategy targets and objectives. The central aim of the Awards is to develop student leaders that are resolute and enthusiastic about developing a more sustainable campus and community. It is envisaged that the positions will deliver a positive experience for the successful candidates by providing an opportunity to gain invaluable experience in sustainability knowledge and application, research, networking, teamwork, and communication.

The internships will run from September 2025 to April 2026, covering twelve teaching weeks in both Semester 1 and Semester 2 (ending on 2 April 2026). The internship will be for 10 hours per week, and the successful candidate will receive a €3,552 scholarship. Successful candidates must be registered students in 25/26. Current final-year students, funded research students, and previous recipients of a Student Sustainability Leadership Award are not eligible to apply for this awards programme.

The role is designed as a student learning opportunity and is not a contract of employment.

Awardees will report to the Director of Sustainability, Dr Richard Manton, and the two interns will work together on sustainability engagement and content creation.

About the Role

We are looking for two enthusiastic and motivated students to help promote sustainability and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) across the University of Galway campus. This role is an exciting opportunity to engage with students, raise awareness about sustainable living, and encourage positive environmental action.

As the Student Sustainability Intern, you will be responsible for managing and growing our social media presence, including Instagram and YouTube, by creating engaging content that highlights sustainability initiatives, events, and practical tips for students. You will support the planning and delivery of sustainability-focused workshops, talks, and campaigns, helping to make sustainability more accessible and relevant to students. A key part of your internship will involve representing sustainability at university events, such as orientation and student fairs, by running information stands and engaging directly with students. You will collaborate with student societies and groups to support sustainable behaviors and initiatives on campus. There is also an international dimension to the internship. Student Sustainability Interns will share experiences and network with similar interns in three other ENLIGHT universities (online meetings and one funded in-person meeting). The Sustainability Office will fund one trip for both interns to Bratislava, Göttingen or Bordeaux (or other ENLIGHT event).

This role is ideal for someone who is enthusiastic about sustainability, enjoys creative content creation, and has persuasive communication and teamwork skills. If you are enthusiastic about making a difference and want to help shape a more sustainable campus, we would love to hear from you!

REQUIREMENTS

Essential requirements for both roles:

- Be a registered student in Academic Year 25/26
- Proven commitment to and interest in sustainability
- Demonstrated ability to work independently on a sustainability related project
- Demonstrable social media knowledge and skills
- Knowledge of website design and lay-out
- Demonstrable event planning skills
- Demonstrated interest in the UN SDGs
- Excellent written and oral communication skills
- Excellent computer literacy and information technology skills
- Determination, enthusiasm and drive to maintain projects
- Resolute, organised, and innovative

Current final-year students, funded research students, and previous recipients of a Student Sustainability Leadership Award are not eligible to apply for this awards program.

PROJECT BACKGROUND

From a lead perspective, our aim is to play a central and transformative role in attaining the SDGs by 2030.

Our Strategy firmly places students at the heart of our sustainability journey and aims to develop our graduates as future sustainability leaders in Ireland and globally, developing the next generation of students, researchers, and innovators for tackling the world's evolving sustainable development challenges.

University of Galway is recognised by the *Times Higher Education* Impact Rankings 2024 as Top University in Ireland and Top 50 in the world for our efforts in progressing the SDGs.
